Rauligh of the same County, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, have granted, bargained & sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain & sell, unto the said Noah J. Rauligh, his Executors, Administrators and Assigns, the following Negroes, Slaves for life, to wit: Boy Jenkins about eighteen years of age, Woman Emily, about twenty five years of age, and her female child Maria, aged about eighteen months. To have and to hold all and singular the said Negroes, Jenkins, Emily and Maria, slaves for life, unto the said Noah J. Rauligh, his Executors, Administrators and Assigns, to his and their only proper use and behoof, all of which said Negroes I have delivered and am now in the possession of the said Noah J. Rauligh. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty ninth day of December in the year Eighteen hundred and forty six.
