 from was executed on 26th day of January 1843
 Wesley Phillips. Show all men by these presents that I Wesley
 Phillips of Unkechster county in Maryland, for and in consideration
 of the sum of fifty dollars current money to me in hand paid by
 Thomas J. H. Eccleston of the county and State aforesaid at and before the sealing
 and delivering hereof: the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge
 hath granted, bargained and sold & by these presents do grant
 bargain and sell unto the said Thomas J. H. Eccleston his heirs & assigns
 all the following named property viz, one gig & harness, one wheat
 fan, one horse cart, and harness, one horse, three mares & two colts,
 one yoke of oxen and one cart sixteen head of cattle old and young
 nineteen head of sheep, forty head of hogs, sows, swats & pigs, thirty
 two bushels of wheat, sowed on the said Eccleston's White Hill farm
 fifty barrels of corn, forty bushels of oats, fifteen hundred weight of
 pork, five thousand weight of lard, all my house and kitchen
 furniture, all my farming implements, of every sort and kind
 all the corn fodder and provender on the said farm, and one maid
 servant hired for the current year of the said Eccleston, all which
 property is now in my possession, I have & to hold the same divid-
 ed property as he bargained & sold to the said Thomas J. H. Eccleston
 & to his heirs and assigns present and for his and their only proper
 use and benefit. And I the said Wesley Phillips for myself, my heirs
 & assigns shall and will warrant and defend by these
 presents, to the said Eccleston his heirs and assigns, all the said property
 above described, against me my heirs and assigns, & against every
 person claiming the same, or any part or portion thereof.
