Davis shall well and truly execute the office of Constable of Election District no 3, in all things appertaining thereto, & shall also well and truly account for all moneys placed in his hands for collections, and shall also well and truly pay all sums of money received by him, then the obligation to be void: otherwise, of full force and virtue in law.
