James Dixon Do it remembered that the following bill of sale was recorded from [unclear] on the 13<sup>th</sup> day 1843 - Know all men by these presents that I John Henry of Worcester County and state of Maryland for and in consideration of the sum of twenty nine dollars to me in hand paid by James Dixon of the County and state aforesaid have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said James Dixon 1 old Bay Horse & cart 1 mare 8 years old 2 beds & furniture 2 dozen chairs 3 Iron pots Loom & Spider 1 Heifer 2 years old 1 shawl & chest 2 hoes & 1 Spade and all my poultry above bargained & sold unto the said James Dixon his heirs executors administrators and assigns against me the said John Henry of the aforesaid County & state my heirs executors administrators and assigns against all and every other person or persons shall and a will warrant and defend unto the said James Dixon him and his heirs forever. Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 13<sup>th</sup> day of February 1843.
