Most remembered that the following Bill of Sale was recorded on the 4th April 1843 Court.

I know all men by these presents that I William Colhoun Executor of Sarah L. Dayton for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty dollars current money to me in hand paid by Noah J. Howells have granted, bargained and sold and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto the said Noah J. Howells (Sarah L. Dayton's) Negro woman named Eliza left free by the will of Sarah L. Dayton and whose term of service has been extended by the orphans Court and found in way and mind to have and to hold the said Negro for the term of four years ending the last day of December 1846 on account of an insufficiency of assets to pay the legacies bequeathed by the will of Sarah L. Dayton dec^d as above bargained and sold unto the said Noah J. Howells his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, against me, the said William Colhoun as Executor of Sarah L. Dayton my heirs, executors, administrators, and against all and every other person or persons, shall and will warrant and defend. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal, this fourth day of April 1843
