Wilburn have put the said W^m M^r Edmondson in full possession by delivery unto him the said W^m M^r Edmondson one Pen Knife at the sealing and delivery of these presents, in the name of the whole premises hereby bargained and sold, or intended to be unto him the said W^m M^r Edmondson as aforesaid.
