




with the said John Reed to keep the ferry over the north west fork of the Nanticoke

 ition of the above obligation is such that if the above bounden John Reed shall  
 faithfully & diligently keep the said ferry over the north west fork of Nanti-  
 coke river commonly called the Protches ferry from day light to day light  
 from the first of November to the first March and from an hour before to an  
 hour after light for the residue of the year commencing on the first day of May  
 1843 and ending twelve months thereafter and shall keep constantly  
 and in good order a scow that will safely carry six passengers and their  
 horses at one trip with an able bodied and skillfull hand to attend the  
 ferry aforesaid and shall not charge or receive any greater prices for ferri-  
 age than what is allowed by law then the above obligation to be void otherwise  
 of force

 supplement to the act entitled an additional supplement to the act  
 entitled an act to regulate ferries have contracted with the said Isaac  
 Dunnoek to keep the ferry over fishing creek from Meekins Neck  
 to Hoopers Island and agree to allow the said Isaac Dunnoek the sum  
 of one hundred & forty dollars current money for the same. Now the  
 condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bounden  
 Isaac Dunnoek shall faithfully and diligently keep the said  
 ferry over fishing creek from Meekins Neck to Hoopers Island from  
 day light to day light from the first of November to the first of Mar-  
 -ch and from an hour before to an hour after day light for the residue  
 of the year commencing the first day of May 1843 and ending twelve  
 months thereafter and shall keep constantly and in good order a  
 Boat or scow that will safely carry three passengers and their horses
