I Edward Strub of the Town of Cambridge, Dorchester County in the State of Maryland, for divers good causes & considerations me therunto moving, have released from slavery, liberated, manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from Slavery, liberate, manumit and set free my Negro Woman Airey being of the age Fifty six years and able to work and gain a sufficient live liood and Maintenance, and her the said Negro Woman Airey I do declare to be hence forth free, manumitted and discharged from all manner of service or servitude to me, my Executors or Administrators forever, subject to Maintenance by my Estate when an incumbrance. In Witness whereof I have hereunto my name & seal affixed this 30<sup>th</sup> day of June in the Year of Our Lord Eighteen hundred and forty eight.
