Henry Bibby } Be it remembered that the following Deed of  
Manumission was recorded October 29th 1848, To wit:  
John Slacum } To all whom it may concern, be it known that I,  
Henry Bibby, of Dorchester County in the state of  
Maryland, for divers good causes and considerations now hereunto  
mention, have released from slavery, liberated, manumitted & set free,  
and by these presents do hereby release from Slavery, liberate, manu-  
mit and set free, my Negro Man named John Slacum, aged about  
thirty three years, and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood to  
maintain and, from and after the expiration of the period of five years  
from the first day of January next, which time will expire on the  
first day of January Eighteen hundred and fifty five - after the  
expiration of which said period of time, I do declare the said  
Negro Man, John Slacum, to be free and discharged from all man-  
ner of servitude or servitude, to me, my heirs, executors, and Adminis-  
trators forever. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
and affixed my seal this tenth day of October in the year  
Eighteen hundred and forty eight.
