 Es. From 50. {the 24<sup>th</sup> day of March 1849 Recd:

William Dean. Know all men by these presents that I William Dean of Geo of  
 Dorchester County State of Maryland for and in consideration of  
 the natural love and affection which I the said William Dean hath and beareth unto  
 my son State I. Dean as also for the better Support and maintenance hereafter of the said  
 State I. Dean hath given granted and Confirmed and by these presents doth give grant  
 and Confirm unto the said State I. Dean his Heirs and Assigns forever One Negro  
 boy Elias a Slave for life which said Negro boy Elias shall warrant and forever defend  
 unto the said State I. Dean his Executors Administrators and Assigns against my Heirs ex-  
 ecutors Administrators and Against all other persons or Persons whatsoever In witness whereof  
 I the said William Dean have hereunto set my hand and Seal this twenty first  
 day of March Eighteen Hundred and Forty Nine.

 and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof I the said Samuel G. Collins do hereby  
 acknowledge have granted bargained and sold and by this present do grant bargain and  
 sell unto the said Andrew G. Collins his Executors Administrators and assigns a certain Negro  
 boy Slave for life named Tom supposed to be about twenty years of age, to care and  
 to Hold the said Negro boy Slave named Tom above bargained and sold as intended to
