

from an hour before to an hour after day light for the residue of the year, commencing the tenth day of May 1849 and ending twelve months thereafter, and shall keep constantly and in good order a scow that will safely carry three passengers & their horses at one trip, with one able bodied skilful hand to attend the said Ferry, and shall not charge or receive any greater price for Ferryage than what is allowed by law, then the above obligation to be void, otherwise of full force and virtue in law.
