Negro Joseph } I know all men by these presents that I, James Collison
of Dorchester County in the State of Maryland, for
divers good causes and considerations, me therunto moving, have released
from slavery, liberated, manumitted and forever set free, and by these
presents do release from slavery, liberate, manumit and forever set
free, my Negro called Joseph, aged five years, to serve twenty five
years from next Christmas day, hereby acknowledging the said Negro
Joseph to be free and discharged from all manner of service or servitude
from and after twenty five years from next Christmas day. Witness my
hand & seal this 19th day of August Anno Domini 1847.
