 mentioned and intended to be to the said James Thompson his executors administrators and
 assigns forever and I the said Henry Lee Thompson for myself my heirs, executors and
 administrators all and Singular, the said Bay mare pigeon and other premises unto the
 said James Thompsons his executors administrators and assigns, all and every other
 person or persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents,
