Know all men by these presents that I Henry Lee Thompson of Dorchester County in the State of Maryland for and in Consideration of the sum of Sixty Dollars current money to me in hand paid by John Thompson of the County and State aforesaid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Henry Lee Thompson do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said John Thompson his executors administrators and assigns one Bay mare named Polly and which said Bay mare Polly is now remaining and in the occupancy of the said Henry Lee Thompson, To Have and to Hold the said Bay mare Polly above bargained and sold or mentioned and intended so to be to the said John Thompson his executors administrators and assigns forever and I the said Henry Lee Thompson for myself my heirs executors and administrators, all and singular the said Bay mare Polly and other the premises unto the said John Thompson his executors administrators and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents of all and singular which said Bay mare Polly, I the said Henry Lee Thompson have put the said John Thompson in full possession by delivering to him the said John Thompson the aforesaid Bay mare Polly at the sealing and delivering of these presents it being the property hereby bargained and sold or mentioned and intended to be so unto him the said John Thompson as aforesaid. - Witness my hand and seal this Seventh day of October Anno Domini Eighteen hundred and fifty. -
