Be it remembered & it is hereby certified that the following Deed of Manumission was recorded on the 10th day of December A. D. 1850, To wit:

To all whom it may concern, be it known that I, Mary Eunnalls, of Dorchester County in the State of Maryland, for divers good causes and Considerations me therunto moving, have released from slavery, liberated, manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate, manumit & set free, my Negro Man named Henry Smith, being about the age of twenty nine and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance, and him the said Negro Man, named Henry Smith, I do declare to be free, manumitted & discharged from all manner of service or forfeiture to me, my Executors or administrators, on the first day of January Eighteen hundred & fifty one and former. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this ninth day of December A. D. 1850
