To all whom it may concern, be it known that I, Mary Eunalls, of Dorchester County in the State of Maryland, for divers good causes and considerations me thenceunto moving, have released from slavery, liberate, manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate, manumit & set free, my Negro Man named Henry Smith, being about the age of twenty nine and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance, and him the said Negro man, named Henry Smith, I do declare to be free, manumitted & discharged from all manner of service or servitude to me, my executors or administrators, on the first day of January Eighteen hundred & fifty one and former. In witness whereof I have unto set my hand and seal this ninth day of December A.D. 1850
