In witness I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 26th day of December A. D. 1850.

To all whom it may concern, be it known that I, Delia N. Byers, of Dorchester County in the State of Maryland, for divers good causes and considerations annexments more, have released from slavery, liberated, manumitted & set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate, manumit & set free, my Negro Woman named Prescilla, being of the age of seventeen years, and able to work & gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance; and her, the said Negro Woman named Prescilla, I do declare to be henceforth free, manumitted & discharged from all manner of servitude or service to me, my Executors or Administrators, forever.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty fifth day of December eighteen hundred and fifty.
