In witness I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 26th day of December A. D. 1850.

Be it remembered & it is hereby certified that the following Act of Manumission was recorded on the 26th day of December in the year 1850, To Wit:

To all whom it may concern, be it known that I, Delia N. Byers, of Dorchester County in the State of Maryland, for divers good causes and considerations aforesaid moving, have released from slavery, liberated, manumitted & set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate, manumit & set free, my Negro Woman named Priscilla, being of the age of fourteen years, and able to work & gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance; and her, the said Negro Woman named Priscilla, I do declare to be henceforth free, manumitted & discharged from all manner of servitude or service to me, my Executors or Administrators, forever.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty sixth day of December Eighteen hundred and fifty.
