 and considerations on thoughts moving, have released from slavery, liberated,
 manumitted & set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery,
 liberate, manumit & set free, on the twenty fifth day of December Eighteen
 hundred & sixty three, my Negro Man named Isac Bolin, being about
 eighteen years old, and able to work & gain a sufficient livelihood &
 maintenance; and him the said Negro Man, named Isac Bolin, I do
 declare to be thenceforth free, manumitted & discharged from all man-
 ner of service or servitude to me, my executors or Administrators,
 forever. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this ninth
 day of January Anno Domini 1851.
