Wright, his heirs Executors, Administrators and Assigns, the full sum of three hundred & eighty eight dollars and thirty seven cents, current money, with legal interest for the same, on or before the first day of January one thousand eight hundred & fifty two, which sum of money is due and owing to the said Martin L. Wright, first on a note of hand dated September 14th in the year eighteen hundred & forty eight; a balance this day of two dollars and sixty five cents, paid on a demand of balance of thirty two dollars and thirty three cents, dated September the nineteenth day one thousand eight hundred & forty eight; for Black Water Farm, third a balance due on a demand for Black Water Farm dated January the fourth one thousand eight hundred & fifty with James A. Stewart as security for the sum of one hundred and twenty five dollars and sixty nine cents, on the third of July eighteen hundred and fifty one. Fourth on a note of hand against James Clark Sr., James Clark Junr. and Durham Clark, jointly, dated March the 10th eighteen hundred and forty nine, for fifty five dollars and seventy cents due this day.
