I know all men by their persons that I, Ann Jane Barrow, of Baltimore City and State of Maryland, for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar, current money of Maryland, in hand paid by Hannah E. H. Crockett of the County of Dorchester and State aforesaid, at or before the sealing of their persons, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained and sold, and by their persons do grant, bargain & sell unto the said Hannah E. H. Crockett, her Executors, Administrators & Assigns, one Negro Woman Caroline, aged twenty one years, a Slave for life: To have and to hold the said Negro Woman Caroline, as above bargained & sold, to the said Hannah E. H. Crockett, her Executors, Administrators & Assigns forever. And I, the said Ann Jane Barrow, for myself, my heirs, Executors & Administrators, the said Negro Woman Caroline unto the said Hannah E. H. Crockett, her Executors, Administrators & Assigns
