from Slavery, liberated, Manumitted and absolved you, and by these
presents do hereby release from Slavery, liberate, Manumit, and set
free my Negro Man named Lemm Jolly, being of the age of forty
years, and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and main-
-aintenance, and him the said Lemm Jolly, I do declare to be hence-
-forth free, Manumitted and discharged, from all manner of ser-
-vice or servitude to me. My executor and administrators firm, In
testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 2 day
of December A. D. 1851

Conner have granted, bargained, sold, conveyed and transferred and by
these presents do grant, bargain, sell, convey and transfer, unto the said
Richard R. Conner his heirs and assigns, the following personal property
Goods and Chattels to wit: One Saddle Horse one Horse Cart and harness
one Wood Cut three fows - fifty barrels of Corn more or less, one
Plow, one harrow, one Saddle and bridle, four Beds, Bedsteads and furniture,
three thousand pounds of Blade Dodder, more or less fifteen hundred pounds
of top Dodder, more or less, two Iron chairs, five Tables, one bureau, two
