Goldsborough of Berkester County and State of Maryland, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto the said Charles F. Goldsborough his heirs and assigns, The printing press and all the type of a certain newspaper called and known by the name of the "Cambridge Chronicle", together with all the fixtures and all and singular every other articles belonging to and now in the office of the said newspaper, which said type, press and other fixtures are now in a certain office on Poplar Street in the town of Cambridge, and now in the occupation and possession of the said Charles F. Goldsborough, to have and to hold all and singular the said press, type and other the premises, as above bargained and sold unto the said Charles F. Goldsborough his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, against us the said William Frazier and Thomas J. Frazier, our heirs, executors and administrators, and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and forever defend.
