State of Maryland, are held & firmly bound unto the State of Maryland in the full and just sum of Two thousand dollars, current Money of the United States, to be paid to the said State or its Attorney; to the which payment well and truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves, our heirs, Executors and Administrators, jointly & severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals and dated this 19th day of February 1848.

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bounden Robert Bell shall well and truly execute the Office of Constable of Cambridge in Dorchester County, in all things appertaining thereto, and shall well and truly assent for all monies placed in his hands for collection, and shall also well and truly pay all sums of Money received by him, then the above obligation to be void, otherwise of full force & virtue in Law.
