from Ex^d. was made on the 4th day of June 1847, to wit:
Hooper C. Hicks Esq^r. I know all men by these presents, that Hooper C. Hicks
of B. Awsworth Executor of Beacham Awsworth, dec^d. of Dorchester
County and State of Maryland, for and in consideration
of the sum of four hundred and twelve dollars and fifty cents, lawful
money of the United States, in hand paid by Benton H. Crockett, at
or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the sum whereof is
hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents
do grant, bargain and sell unto the said Benton H. Crockett, his Execu-
tors, Administrators and Assigns, A Negro Girl named Caroline,
aged about nineteen years, the property of the said Beacham Aw-
sworth, dec^d, and a slave for life - To have and to hold the
said described Negro Girl Caroline to the said Benton H. Crockett,
his Executors, Administrators and Assigns forever - And the said
Hooper C. Hicks, Ex^d of B. Awsworth, for himself, heirs, executors
and Administrators, the said Negro Girl Caroline unto the said
Benton H. Crockett, his Executors, Administrators and Assigns,
against him the said Hooper C. Hicks, his Executors and Adminis-
trators, and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever,
shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty
fourth day of May Eighteen hundred and forty seven (1847)
