Sundry Negroes } State of Maryland, Dorchester County, set:

I know all men by these presents that I Mary Jones of the County and State aforesaid, and of the Town of Viccars, for divers good causes and considerations, on themselves moving, have released from Slavery, liberated, manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate, manumit and set free, the following Negro Slaves, to wit: My Negro Woman Juli Ann Thompson, aged about twenty five years, and her two Children Hester Ann Dockins, aged about five years, and Sarah Emily Dockins, aged about eight months, and they the said woman Juli Ann Thompson and Children Hester Ann and Sarah Emily, I declare to be henceforth free, manumitted and discharged from all manner of service, or servitude, to me, my Executors or Administrators, forever. In witness whereof I have here to set my hand & seal this 22^d day of March 1848.
