- [(n)](L) "Sewerage system" has the meaning as stated in § 9-601(n) of the Environment Article.
- [(o)](M) "State" means the State of Maryland and any of its departments, bureaus, agencies, or other instrumentalities.
 - [(p)](N) "Subdistrict" means a service area within the [District] COUNTY.
- [(q)](0) "United States" means the United States of America and any of its departments, bureaus, agencies, or other instrumentalities.
- [(r)](P) "Water system" has the meaning stated in § 9-601(q) of the Environment Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

 [6-201.
- (a) (1) There is a public body politic and corporate of the State of Maryland known as the Washington County Sanitary District.
- (2) The District may exercise the powers and duties conferred by this title in accordance with the resolution passed by the county establishing the District.
 - (b) By either ordinance or resolution, the county may:
 - (1) Change the name of the District or of the Commission or both;
 - (2) Amend the boundaries of the District; and
- (3) Change, add to, or diminish the powers and purposes of the District and the Commission, provided that the same or are consistent with other provisions of this title and the Code.
- (c) The county shall establish and maintain a suitable and properly indexed file for the recording of documents under this title.]

 [6-202.
- (a) (1) The Commission shall exercise the powers of the District conferred by this title.
- (2) The Commission shall consist of from five to seven members appointed by the county.
- (3) Each of the members shall be a resident of or a property owner in a different subdistrict of the District.
- (4) (i) Each member serves for a term of five years beginning January 1 after the appointment of the member and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- (ii) The terms of members shall be staggered as required by the terms of the members of the Commission serving on October 1, 1994.
 - (iii) A member may serve for more than one term.
