- (D) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE STAFF SUPPORT TO THE COMMISSION.
- (E) THE COMMISSION MAY ELECT AN EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS THAT, DURING THE INTERVALS BETWEEN MEETINGS OF THE COMMISSION, MAY EXERCISE ALL THE POWERS AND FUNCTIONS OF THE COMMISSION.
- (F) IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER POWERS SET FORTH IN THIS TITLE, THE COMMISSION MAY:
- (1) ADOPT BYLAWS TO REGULATE ITS AFFAIRS AND THE CONDUCT OF ITS BUSINESS;
- (2) CONTRACT FOR AND ENGAGE THE SERVICES OF CONSULTANTS; AND
- (3) DO ANYTHING NECESSARY OR CONVENIENT TO CARRY OUT ITS POWERS AND THE PURPOSES OF THIS TITLE.

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- (A) (1) THE COMMISSION MAY NOT EXCEED 21 25 VOTING MEMBERS AND SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE.
- (2) THE SECRETARY SHALL SERVE AS A NONVOTING EX OFFICIO COMMISSION MEMBER.
- (3) THE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR SHALL BE INDIVIDUALS WITH SUBSTANTIAL INTEREST OR EXPERIENCE IN BUSINESS OR KNOWLEDGE OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.
- (4) (1) THE GOVERNOR SHALL TAKE INTO CONSIDERATION GEOGRAPHIC AND INDUSTRY REPRESENTATION WHEN APPOINTING THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION. THE GEOGRAPHIC REPRESENTATION SHALL COVER ALL REGIONS OF THE STATE.
- (II) THE GEOGRAPHIC REPRESENTATION OF THE COMMISSION SHALL COVER THE ENTIRE STATE.
- (III) THE COMMISSION SHALL INCLUDE AT LEAST ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM EACH OF THE FOLLOWING REGIONS:
 - 1. THE UPPER EASTERN SHORE;
 - 2. THE LOWER EASTERN SHORE;
- 3. <u>THE TRI-COUNTY AREA OF SOUTHERN MARYLAND</u> (CHARLES, CALVERT, AND ST. MARY'S COUNTIES);
 - 4. GARRETT AND ALLEGANY COUNTIES; AND
 - 5. CARROLL, FREDERICK, AND WASHINGTON COUNTIES.
