- (A) THERE IS A LEAD HAZARD ADVISORY COMMITTEE IN THE DEPARTMENT.
- (B) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP ALL REGULATIONS, POLICIES, AND GUIDELINES IMPLEMENTING THE PROGRAM IN CONSULTATION WITH THE LEAD HAZARD ADVISORY COMMITTEE.
- (C) THE LEAD HAZARD ADVISORY COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF SEVEN MEMBERS, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR AS FOLLOWS:
- (1) THE SECRETARY OF THE DEPARTMENT OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;
- (2) THE SECRETARY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;
- (3) THE SECRETARY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE:
- (4) A MEMBER OF THE LEAD POISONING REDUCTION PREVENTION COMMISSION;
- (5) A REPRESENTATIVE OF OWNERS OF RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTY BUILT BEFORE 1950;
- (6) A REPRESENTATIVE OF A CHILD, YOUTH, OR HEALTH ADVOCACY GROUP; AND
- (7) A MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC WHO HAS AN INTEREST IN THE SUBJECT OF LEAD IN THE ENVIRONMENT.
- (D) THE SECRETARY OF THE DEPARTMENT OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE SHALL BE THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE LEAD HAZARD ADVISORY COMMITTEE.
- (E) (1) THE TERM OF A MEMBER OF THE LEAD HAZARD ADVISORY COMMITTEE IS 4 YEARS.
- (2) THE TERMS OF THE INITIAL MEMBERS OF THE LEAD HAZARD ADVISORY COMMITTEE EXPIRE AS FOLLOWS:
 - (I) TWO IN 1997:
 - (II) TWO IN 1998; AND
 - (III) THREE IN 1999.
- (3) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.
- (4) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND OUALIFIES.
