Article 38 - Fines and Forfeitures

5.

(a) One half of the fines imposed and recognizances forfeited to the circuit court for the several counties of the State shall be paid to the clerks of the respective courts, to be expended under the direction of the judge or judges of said courts, for the augmentation of the libraries of said courts. This section does not apply to Anne Arundel, Somerset, AND Howard [and Talbot] Counties. The clerk shall retain a 5 percent commission on the fines and forfeitures collected. In Baltimore County, this section shall not apply to fines imposed in gambling cases.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1995.
