SECTION 17. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, at the end of June 30, [1995] 1997, and with no further action required by the General Assembly, § 21-315 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article, as enacted by Section 2 of this Act, shall be void, and § 21-315 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article as enacted by Section 3 of this Act shall take effect. This section supersedes the termination and abrogation provisions of Section 3 of Chapter 234 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1993.

~~SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act is contingent on the taking effect of the termination provision specified in Section 17 of Chapter 6 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1994, as amended by Section 3 of this Act. If that termination provision takes effect, Section 1 of this Act shall be void.~~

(Senate Bill 198)

AN ACT concerning

Harford County – Sheriff’s Office

FOR the purpose of prohibiting certain employees in the Harford County Sheriff’s Office from being terminated without just cause; providing that certain employees serve at the pleasure of the Sheriff; prohibiting certain employees from being reduced below a certain rank without just cause; making a stylistic change; and generally relating to employee rights for employees of the Harford County Sheriff’s Office.
