CHAPTER 391

(Senate Bill 545)

AN ACT concerning

Schools – Possession of Portable Pagers – Discretionary Arrest

FOR the purpose of altering the law prohibiting the possession of certain portable pagers on public school property; requiring a law enforcement officer to make a certain inquiry under certain circumstances; making the arrest of an individual who violates that law discretionary rather than mandatory; and generally relating to the possession of portable pagers on public school property.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

26-104.

(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
