(As enacted by Chapter ____ (S.B. 10) of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1995)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 24 - Political Subdivisions - Miscellaneous Provisions

16-105.

(f) The Board of Trustees shall keep a record of all its proceedings which shall be open to public inspection. It shall provide, if requested, an opportunity for a full hearing, including the right to counsel and cross-examination for all interested parties in any proceeding as to any benefit, or any part thereof, provided herein. The Board, through its member presiding at any hearing, shall have the power to administer oaths and may apply to the circuit court of any county for a subpoena for any witness, which shall be granted by the court upon finding that the evidence of said witness is necessary to provide a fair hearing, and that requiring attendance by the witness would not be oppressive. The Board may expend from the fund such amounts as may be necessary for the conduct of its proceedings, including but not limited to expenses for investigation, medical or other advice, stenographic service, and the like. [The Attorney General shall be the legal adviser to the board, and shall upon request by the board, assist and advise the board during the conduct of any hearing.] THE LEGAL ADVISER TO THE BALTIMORE CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE THE LEGAL ADVISER TO THE BOARD, AND SHALL UPON REQUEST BY THE BOARD, ASSIST AND ADVISE THE BOARD DURING THE CONDUCT OF ANY HEARING.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1995.
