CHAPTER 464

(House Bill 1069)

AN ACT concerning

Mental Hygiene Facilities – Citizens' Advisory Boards

FOR the purpose of repealing the specific geographical assignment of membership on the citizens' advisory board of each State facility operated by the Mental Hygiene Administration; and generally relating to the citizens' advisory boards.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article – Health – General

Section 10-411(b)

Annotated Code of Maryland

(1994 Replacement Volume and 1994 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Health – General

10-411.

(b) [(1)] Each member of a Board shall be a citizen of this State.

[(2) Except for the Crownsville Hospital Center, the Regional Institute for Children and Adolescents in Prince George's County, and the Spring Grove Hospital Center, each member of the Board for a State facility shall be a resident of the district that the State facility serves.

(3) Of the 11 members appointed to the Board for the Crownsville Hospital Center:

- (i) 6 shall be residents of Anne Arundel County;
- (ii) 1 shall be a resident of Baltimore City;
- (iii) 1 shall be a resident of Calvert County;
