

[(2)] (3) (i) Each certification executed under this subsection shall be retained by the licensee for at least 1 year.

(ii) The certifications shall be available for examination during regular business hours by an authorized representative of the Board of License Commissioners.

[(3)](4) The Board of License Commissioners shall adopt regulations to implement this subsection.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1995.

**(House Bill 1206)**

AN ACT concerning

**Incarcerated Minors – Consent to Medical Care and Advice**
