- (a) To qualify for certification as a security guard, an individual shall:
  - (1) meet the standards set by the [Superintendent] SECRETARY;
- (2) be an employee of or an applicant for employment with a licensed private detective agency;
- (3) submit to the licensed private detective agency, for forwarding to the [Superintendent] SECRETARY:
- (i) a sworn application on the form the [Superintendent] SECRETARY provides;
- (ii) 2 sets of fingerprint cards marked with the applicant's fingerprints; and
  - (iii) a nonrefundable application fee of \$15; and
- (4) pay to the licensed private detective agency, for forwarding to the [Superintendent] SECRETARY, the cost of the fingerprint card record checks.
- (b) On receipt from an applicant for certification as a security guard, a licensed private detective agency shall forward to the [Superintendent] SECRETARY the applicant's application form, fingerprint cards, and records fee.

- (a) The [Superintendent] SECRETARY shall certify as a security guard each individual whose application has been submitted as required by this subtitle and who meets the requirements of this subtitle.
- (b) Within 5 days after the [Superintendent] SECRETARY denies the application of an individual for certification as a security guard, the [Superintendent] SECRETARY shall send written notice of the denial to the licensed private detective agency that submitted the application.
