(a) Except as otherwise provided in this title, a person shall be licensed by the [Superintendent] SECRETARY as a security systems technician before the person may engage in the business of providing security systems services in the State.

(b) A person who sells security systems at the protected premises or the premises to be protected but does not install, maintain, or repair those systems:

(1) is not required to be licensed under this title; but

(2) is required to:

(i) register with the [Superintendent] SECRETARY once every 2 years;

(ii) provide the information the [Superintendent] SECRETARY requires; and

(iii) pay a fee of \$15.
