- (A) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, THE CRITERIA AND STANDARDS USED BY A PRIVATE REVIEW AGENT OR HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATION IN PERFORMING UTILIZATION REVIEW OF HOSPITAL SERVICES RELATED TO MATERNITY AND NEWBORN CARE, INCLUDING LENGTH OF STAY, SHALL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MEDICAL CRITERIA OUTLINED IN THE MOST CURRENT VERSION OF THE "GUIDELINES FOR PERINATAL CARE" PREPARED BY THE AMERICAN ACADEMY OF PEDIATRICS AND THE AMERICAN COLLEGE OF OBSTETRICIANS AND GYNECOLOGISTS.
- (B) A PRIVATE REVIEW AGENT <u>OR HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATION</u> MAY AUTHORIZE A SHORTER LENGTH OF HOSPITAL STAY FOR SERVICES RELATED TO MATERNITY AND NEWBORN CARE <u>IF PROVIDED THE NEWBORN MEETS THE CRITERIA FOR MEDICAL STABILITY IN THE "GUIDELINES FOR PERINATAL CARE" AND THE PRIVATE REVIEW AGENT AUTHORIZES A SUFFICIENT NUMBER OF POSTPARTUM HOME VISITS FOR THE MOTHER AND CHILD OR HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATION AUTHORIZES FOR THE MOTHER AND CHILD AN INITIAL POSTPARTUM HOME VISIT WHICH WOULD INCLUDE THE COLLECTION OF AN ADEQUATE SAMPLE FOR THE HEREDITARY AND METABOLIC NEWBORN SCREENING, WHEN INDICATED.</u>
