under certain circumstances; authorizing the use of a certain title titles; making a certain exception; requiring the Board to certify a licensed optometrist as a diagnostically certified optometrist under certain circumstances; requiring the Board to certify a licensed optometrist as a therapeutically certified optometrist under certain circumstances; authorizing diagnostically therapeutically certified optometrists to administer and prescribe certain therapeutic pharmaceutical agents and to, remove certain foreign bodies from the human eye and adnexa, and perform certain other therapeutic tasks; prohibiting the performance of certain procedures; defining certain terms; altering certain definitions; making the provisions of this Act severable; and generally relating to the administering and prescribing of therapeutic pharmaceutical agents and the removal of foreign bodies from the human eye and adnexa by therapeutically the scope of practice of therapeutically and diagnostically certified optometrists.

Preamble

WHEREAS, The General Assembly, in enacting this Act, has sought the input and cooperation of the Maryland Optometric Association, the Maryland Society of Eye Physicians and Surgeons, and the Secretary of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene; and

WHEREAS, The Maryland Optometric Association, the Maryland Society of Eye Physicians and Surgeons, and the Secretary of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene have agreed not to seek nor support before the General Assembly any expansion in the law regarding the scope of optometric practice until at least January 1, 2000; and

WHEREAS, It is the intent of the General Assembly to expand the scope of optometric practice only to the extent specified in this Act; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
