

(e) (2) (ii) However, a member of the Maryland Transportation Authority Police Force is subject to Division I of the State Personnel Article to the same extent that a member of the DEPARTMENT OF [Maryland] State Police is subject to that law.

(g) (1) Any person who was a member in good standing, as of July 1, 1977, of the Maryland Aviation Administration Police Force of the Department of Transportation and subsequently an airport police employee of the [Maryland] State Police, shall become a member of the Maryland Transportation Authority Police Force, and shall continue as such without diminution in salary, except for shift differential, until retirement, resignation, or termination, and shall be paid in accordance with the Maryland Transportation Authority Police Force pay plan.

DRAFTER'S NOTE:

Subsections (c)(1) and (2), (e)(2)(ii), and (g)(1) of this section are amended to reflect the establishment of the Department of State Police as a principal department of State government by Chs. 165 and 166, Acts of 1994, to reflect the status of the head of the Department as a Secretary of a principal department of State government, to make clarifying changes, and to delete surplus language.

(c) Any police officer who is informed of an aeronautics accident in this State shall:

(1) Report the accident to the Administration and to the appropriate federal agency; and

(2) To the extent practicable, preserve, protect, and prevent the removal of the component parts of any aircraft involved in the accident until the DEPARTMENT OF [Maryland] State Police or the appropriate federal agency institutes an investigation.

(b) (3) In addition to the information required under paragraph (2) of this subsection, the applicant shall send a complete copy of the application to the DEPARTMENT OF [Maryland] State Police.

(e) A violation of any provision of this section or of any other applicable gaming law of the State:

(1) Shall be investigated jointly by the Administration and the DEPARTMENT OF State Police; and
