- (2) Any civilian employee of the DEPARTMENT OF [Maryland] State Police assigned to enforce this subtitle, but only while acting under written authorization of the [Superintendent] SECRETARY of the [Maryland] State Police; or
 - (3) Any civilian employee of a local government who is:
- (i) Acting under the immediate direction and control of a uniformed police officer;
- (ii) Acting under written authorization of the [Superintendent] SECRETARY of the [Maryland] State Police; and
