SUBTITLE 7. INSECT STING EMERGENCY TREATMENT PROGRAM.

13-701.

THE INSECT STING EMERGENCY TREATMENT PROGRAM IS A PROGRAM IN THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING A MEANS OF AUTHORIZING CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS TO ADMINISTER LIFE-SAVING TREATMENT TO PERSONS WHO HAVE SEVERE ADVERSE REACTIONS TO INSECT STINGS WHEN PHYSICIAN SERVICES OR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ARE NOT IMMEDIATELY AVAILABLE.

13-702.

(A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

(B) "CERTIFICATE" MEANS A CERTIFICATE ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT OR A PRIVATE OR PUBLIC ENTITY TO ADMINISTER SUBCUTANEOUS INJECTIONS OF EPINEPHRINE.

(C) "PROGRAM" MEANS THE INSECT STING EMERGENCY TREATMENT PROGRAM.

13-703.

THE DEPARTMENT MAY:

(1) ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROGRAM;

(2) COLLECT FEES NECESSARY FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROGRAM;

(3) ISSUE AND RENEW CERTIFICATES TO PERSONS MEETING THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND

(4) (I) CONDUCT EDUCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAMS DESCRIBED IN § 13-704 (E) OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND

(II) APPROVE EDUCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAMS CONDUCTED BY OTHER STATE AGENCIES OR PRIVATE ENTITIES.

13-704.

(A) TO QUALIFY FOR A CERTIFICATE, AN INDIVIDUAL SHALL MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

(B) THE APPLICANT SHALL BE OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER.

(C) THE APPLICANT SHALL BE AT LEAST 18 YEARS OLD.
