- (f) Notwithstanding any other provision of this title governing the allocation of takeout, for a race that is held by an out-of-state facility and simulcast to a licensee in this State, the allocation of takeout on bets made in this State that are commingled in a common mutuel pool shall be, subject to the approval of the Commission, allocated in the following manner:
- (1) to the State for taxes on the handle of the licensee as provided under this title;
 - (2) [to the applicable pension funds created by this title;
- (3)] to the host racing association where live racing is conducted in an amount determined by the licensee and the out-of-state facility; and
- [(4)](3) the remainder to the licensee, THE APPLICABLE PENSION FUNDS CREATED BY THIS TITLE, purse money, and the applicable bred fund in proportion to their respective shares of the takeout under this title.

- (c) (1) If a retiree receives a State disability retirement allowance or has 16 or more years of creditable service, the retiree or the retiree's surviving spouse or dependent child is entitled to the same State subsidy allowed a State employee.
- (2) In all other cases, if a retiree has at least 5 years of creditable service, the retiree or the retiree's surviving spouse or dependent child is entitled to 1/16 of the State subsidy allowed a State employee for each year of the retiree's creditable service up to 16 years.
