Chapter 98 of the Acts of 1994

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the provisions of this Act are subject to the abrogation provisions of Chapter 452 of the Acts of 1991, AS AMENDED BY CHAPTER 334 OF THE ACTS OF 1993, and the relevant provisions of Class B (DT) licenses are included within those abrogation provisions.

Chapter 360 of the Acts of 1994

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, has been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of [3 years from the date of enactment] MAY 31, 1997, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

DRAFTER'S NOTE:

Error: Chapter 360 failed to receive a three-fifths vote in its passage through the legislative process and, pursuant to the Maryland Constitution, became effective on June 1, 1994, notwithstanding the emergency effective date language of Section 2. The date of termination is changed to effectuate a three year period of effect following June 1, 1994.

Chapter 528 of the Acts of 1994

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That [Section 1] SECTIONS 1 AND 3 of this Act shall take effect June 1, 1994 [and]. SECTION 1 OF THIS ACT shall remain in effect until October 1, 1994.
