## 1995 LAWS OF MARYLAND

## Article - State Personnel and Pensions

TITLE 39. SPECIAL RETIREMENT OR PENSION SYSTEMS.

39-101.

- (A) IN THIS TITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.
- (B) "COUNTY" MEANS A COUNTY OF THE STATE AND, UNLESS EXPRESSLY PROVIDED OTHERWISE, BALTIMORE CITY.
- (C) (1) "SPECIAL RETIREMENT OR PENSION SYSTEM" MEANS A RETIREMENT OR PENSION SYSTEM THAT:
  - (1) PROVIDES RETIREMENT OR PENSION BENEFITS; AND
- (2) (II) ALLOWS A COUNTY EXECUTIVE, COUNTY COUNCIL MEMBER, OR COUNTY COMMISSIONER, OR APPOINTED OFFICIAL TO PARTICIPATE.
  - (2) "SPECIAL RETIREMENT OR PENSION SYSTEM" DOES NOT INCLUDE:
- (I) A DEFINED CONTRIBUTION PLAN WITH BENEFITS DETERMINED BY AN ACTUARIAL COMPUTATION BASED ON EMPLOYEE CONTRIBUTIONS AND THE ACCRUED RETURN ON THOSE CONTRIBUTIONS; OR
- (II) A RETIREMENT OR PENSION PLAN THAT DETERMINES BENEFIT AMOUNTS USING COMPUTATIONS OR OTHER SPECIFIC METHODS ENACTED AS AN ORDINANCE BY THE GOVERNING BODY.

39-102.

- (A) A COUNTY MAY NOT CREATE A SPECIAL RETIREMENT OR PENSION SYSTEM THAT ALLOWS THE SYSTEM'S BENEFITS TO BE SET OR AMENDED ADMINISTRATIVELY BY A MEANS OTHER THAN BY ORDINANCE ENACTED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE COUNTY.
- (B) ON OR AFTER JANUARY FEBRUARY 1, 1996, A COUNTY MAY CREATE A SPECIAL RETIREMENT OR PENSION SYSTEM IF THE SYSTEM MEETS THE REOUIREMENTS STATED IN THIS SECTION.
- (C) (1) A COUNTY THAT CREATES A SPECIAL RETIREMENT OR PENSION SYSTEM SHALL CREATE THE SYSTEM BY AN ORDINANCE ENACTED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE COUNTY.
- (2) THE ORDINANCE CREATING THE <del>LOCAL</del> <u>SPECIAL</u> RETIREMENT OR PENSION SYSTEM SHALL SET FORTH:
  - (I) THE BENEFITS TO BE PROVIDED UNDER THE SYSTEM:
- (II) A METHOD OF FUNDING THE SYSTEM THAT COMPLIES WITH SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION; AND
  - (III) A METHOD OF SELECTING TRUSTEES FOR THE SYSTEM.
