~~(1) Those provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law that relate to or are administered and enforced by the Administration; and~~

~~(2) The provisions of any other law that the Administration is authorized to administer and enforce.~~

~~(c) (1) The Administration shall maintain as many offices in this State as the Administrator considers necessary to carry out the powers and duties of the Administration.~~

~~(2) Each office shall be open on the days and during the hours that the Secretary determines are needed to serve the public.~~

~~(d) (1) With the approval of the Secretary, the Administration shall employ the deputies, subordinate officers, clerks, investigators, and other employees necessary to carry out the powers and duties of the Administration.~~

~~(2) Except as otherwise provided by law, and subject to § 2-103.4 of this article, each deputy, officer, and employee of the Administration:~~

~~(i) Is in the classified service of the State Personnel Management System; and~~

~~(ii) Is entitled to the salary provided in the pay plan established under Title 6, Subtitle 1 of the State Personnel Article.~~

~~(e) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the Administration may delegate to the Office of Administrative Hearings the power and authority under the Maryland Vehicle Law to conduct hearings under this article and render proposed findings of fact and proposed conclusions of law.~~

~~(2) The Administration may delegate to the Office of Administrative Hearings the power and authority under the Maryland Vehicle Law to render final decisions in hearings conducted under §§ 13-705.1, 21-1005, and 22-218, and Title 16, Subtitles 1 through 4 of this article.~~

~~(f) BY SEPTEMBER 30, 1996, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL ESTABLISH A PROGRAM TO EDUCATE BICYCLISTS AND THE GENERAL PUBLIC REGARDING THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE THAT RELATE TO BICYCLE ACCESS TO STATE HIGHWAYS AND TRANSIT FACILITIES.~~
