(ii) The Secretary of [Economic and Employment Development] LABOR, LICENSING, AND REGULATION stating that all unemployment insurance contributions, reimbursement payments, and interest not barred by limitations and payable by the corporation to the Secretary are paid or provided for in a manner satisfactory to the Secretary.

- (a) There is a Division of Labor and Industry in the Department of [Licensing] LABOR, LICENSING, and Regulation.

- (f) "Board of Appeals" means the Board of Appeals of the Department of [Economic and Employment Development] LABOR, LICENSING, AND REGULATION.
- (k) "Department" means the Department of [Economic and Employment Development] LABOR, LICENSING, AND REGULATION.
- (s) "Secretary" means the Secretary of [Economic and Employment Development] LABOR, LICENSING, AND REGULATION.

- (a) A decision of the Board of Appeals is final subject to judicial review under § 8-512 of this subtitle.
- (b) A decision of the Board of Appeals under § 8-806(h) of this title is final within 10 days after mailing or other delivery of the notice of the decision.

8 512.-

- (a) (1) Any-[party] CLAIMANT-OR EMPLOYER who is aggrieved by a final decision of the Board of Appeals may appeal the decision to a circuit court.
- (2) The Board of Appeals may be a party to an appeal under this section and may be represented by the Attorney General or by any qualified lawyer who is a regular salaried employee of the Board of Appeals and who has been designated by it for that purpose on recommendation of the Attorney General.
- (3) A court or an officer of a court may not charge an individual who claims benefits a fee in any proceeding under this title.
