Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 576.

This bill pertains to trusts and trustees' powers. It establishes ascertainable standards (as defined in 26 U.S.C. sections 2041 and 2514 and Treasury regulations) for a trustee to make discretionary distributions and allocations. The bill is applicable to trusts existing on and after October 1, 1995, unless the governing instrument provides otherwise or all parties in interest affirmatively elect otherwise.

Senate Bill 497, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 18, 1995, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 576.
