SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 26A – Criminal Injuries Compensation Act

17.

(a) In this section, "crime" means an act committed by a person in the State which is:

- (1) A crime under Article 27 of the Code;
- (2) A violation of the Transportation Article which is punishable by imprisonment; or
- (3) A crime at common law.
