Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 996.

This bill pertaining to investments and deposits by the Charles County Treasurer limits the Treasurer's short-term investments to less than 270 days. It disallows deposits in building associations. It requires collateral equivalent to the county's deposits or investments, if U.S. government securities are being posted. If other types of collateral are being posted, they must be equivalent to 102 percent of the county's deposits or investments.

Senate Bill 737, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 18, 1995, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 996.
